Defining Catastrophic Services

Catastrophic/serious injury files are very challenging – but can also be very rewarding! Through a range of services you can make a real difference in the lives of your catastrophically injured clients.

Regardless of the specific services that will be required, case management is beneficial for numerous situations, including spinal cord injuries, acquired brain injuries, paediatrics, neurological disorders, multiple orthopedic injuries, burns and amputations. It is the Case Manager's responsibility to formulate a comprehensive rehabilitation plan focused on addressing the client's specific needs and goals.

In terms of catastrophic/serious injury management it is especially important to select a Case Manager who has extensive experience directly with catastrophic/serious injuries. The Case Manager is often a Regulated Health Professional (RHP), such as a Registered Nurse or Occupational Therapist.

Based on the rehabilitation goals, the Case Manager put together a rehabilitation team where each member brings to the process a specific skill. For example, the team could be made up of an Occupational Therapist, Physiotherapist, Speech Language Pathologist, Psychologist, Psychiatrist, and Family Physician.

The Case manager not only coordinates the most appropriate team, she/he also clarifies the roles and boundaries between each team member. In fact, ensuring effective communication is one of the most valuable skills of the astute Case Manager!
